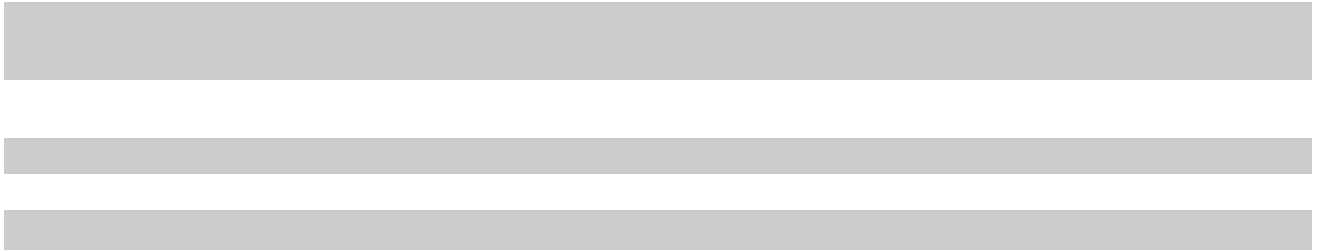

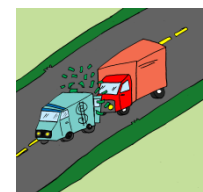

Example: *Coal is mined in Nova Scotia.*

- When you know who or what does the actions.

Example: *The cable TV is connected by the cable company.*

- When you are not interested in who or what does something.

Example: *All the electrical appliances were shut down.*

- When you want to take away the focus of personal responsibility and to give an “official” tone.

Example: *We have been told that the problem will be fixed as soon as possible.*

- To introduce general opinions in an impersonal style.

Example: *It is believed that they once migrated from Asia.*

- To describe processes.

Example: *Lobsters are caught in the coastal waters.*

Remember that if you are more interested in the object but you know who or what does something, you use *by*.
